According to the National Priorities Project (www.nationalpriorities.org) **taxpayers in the State of New Jersey will pay \$33.7 Billion** for Proposed Department of Defense Budget for FY2011. For the same amount of money, the following could be provided:

- **448,411** Elementary School Teachers for One year–*or*-
- **6.1 Million** Students receiving Pell Grants of \$5,550 –*or*-
- **4.7 Million** People receiving Low-Income Healthcare for One year–*or*-
- **2.8 Million** Scholarships for University Students for One year–*or*-
- **4.4 Million** Military Veterans receiving VA Medical care for One year

Taxpayers in the State of New Jersey will pay **\$4.9 Billion** for proposed Afghanistan war spending for FY2011. For the same amount of money, the following could be provided:

- **65,284** Elementary school teachers for one year–*or*-
- **883,102** Students receiving Pell Grants of \$5,550–*or*-
- **683,001** People receiving low-income healthcare for one year–*or*-
- **412,352** Scholarships for University Students for One Year–*or*-
- **644,047** Military Veterans Receiving VA medical care for one year
